SAFE Homes-Rape Crisis Coalition provides

- A 24-hour crisis line.
- Assistance to domestic violence victims in Spartanburg, Cherokee, and Union Counties.
- Assistance to sexual assault victims in Spartanburg and Cherokee Counties.
- Up to 60 days of emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence and their dependent children, including: food, clothing, transportation, limited day care, and tutoring.
- Hospital accompaniment and advocacy for sexual assault victims during the medical/legal protocol.
- Police and court accompaniment and advocacy.
- Crisis counseling.
- Individual and family therapy.
- Case management and follow-up.
- Information on employment, housing, financial aid, budgeting, child support, legal, medical, and social problems.
- Community support/therapy groups for adults and children.
- Community education about domestic violence and sexual assault.
- Training for law enforcement, medical personnel, social services agencies, and other professionals.
- Assistance in completing Domestic Abuse petitions.

Our Spartanburg County Office is open Monday through Friday 8:30 am to 5:00 pm and located on the 3rd Floor of the County Courthouse.

Our Cherokee County Office is open Monday through Friday 8:30 am to 5:00 pm and is located at 405 North Logan Street in Gaffney.

Our Union County Office is open Monday through Friday 8:00 am to 4:30 pm @ 115 Thomas Street in Union.

SAFE Homes-Rape Crisis Coalition is a place for victims and their dependent children to turn to escape violence and abuse in their homes. We offer comprehensive programs providing safety, supportive services, and resources to victims and children. In the absence of such support, many victims would be forced to choose between staying in abusive relationships or living on the streets.

SAFE Homes-Rape Crisis Coalition-Mary's House provides services to domestic violence and sexual assault victims and their family. We offer individual, family, and group psychotherapy to adults and children who have been impacted by violence. This includes clients in the community as well as in the domestic violence shelter.

Individual and Family Therapy is offered Monday thru Friday 8:30 am - 7:00 pm.

Prospective clients may call 864.583.9803 or toll-free 1.800.273.5066 or may come in to Mary's House to enroll. SH-RCC also offers a number of therapy groups, as described below. Fees are determined based on a generous sliding scale, and arrangements will be made at the first appointment. No one will be turned away!

What is group psychotherapy?

In group psychotherapy, approximately 8 to 10 individuals meet with a trained group psychotherapist. During the group meeting time, members talk about what is troubling them. Members are encouraged to give feedback which includes expressing feelings about what someone says or does. Interaction between group members is highly encouraged and provides each person an opportunity to try out new ways of behaving; it also provides members with an opportunity for learning more about the way they interact with others. Group psychotherapy also helps members realize they are not alone...that other people have experienced similar life events, and reactions to those events.

What makes the group psychotherapy situation unique is that it is a closed and safe system. People who join groups are requested to keep the content of the group sessions confidential. Members of a psychotherapy group must be interviewed prior to entering the group, in order to ensure that the prospective member and type of group are a good match.

This group is designed for parents who need to learn information about Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault for self-protection and the protection of their children. The Department of Social Services is the primary referral source for this group.

COMMUNITY GROUPS:

SILVER LININGS RECOVERY GROUP

This group is designed for women over 40 who have been in individual therapy and are now ready to take their abuse recovery to the next step—beyond being a survivor to being a “thrivor” in life.
